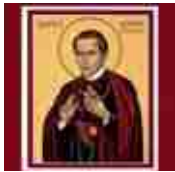
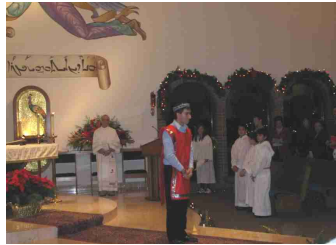

St. John Neumann

Feastday: January 5

John Nepomucene Neumann was born in Bohemia in 1811. He entered the seminary there in 1831 and two years later transferred to the University of Prague, to study theology. He wished to be ordained, but in 1835 his bishop decided there would be no more ordinations since Bohemia had too many priests at the time.

Neumann, who spoke 8 different languages, wrote to other bishops in Europe all of whom replied that they also had too many priests. Inspired by the writings of Bishop Frederic Baraga in America, he sent letters to bishops in America, requesting to be ordained in the United States. In 1836 he came to the US and was ordained to the priesthood. He was assigned by the bishop of the New York diocese to work with German immigrants in mission churches in the Niagara Falls area. He visited the sick, taught catechism, and trained teachers to take over when he left. He was one of 36 priests for 200,000 Catholics. John's parish in New York stretched from Lake Ontario to Pennsylvania. The church had no steeple or floor. John spent most of his time traveling from village to village, visiting the sick and celebrating the Mass at kitchen tables.

Because of the work and the isolation of his parish, John longed for community and so joined the Redemptorists, a congregation of priests and brothers dedicated to helping the poor and most abandoned. He was appointed bishop of Philadelphia in 1852. As bishop, he was the first to organize a diocesan Catholic school system. He is considered one of the founders of Catholic education in this country, he increased the number of Catholic schools in his diocese from two to 100.

John never lost his love and concern for the people. On one visit to a rural parish, the parish priest picked him up in a manure wagon. Seated on a plank stretched over the wagon's contents, John joked, "Have you ever seen such an entourage for a bishop?" The ability to learn languages that had brought him to America led him to learn Spanish, French, Italian, and Dutch so he could hear confessions in at least six languages. When Irish immigration started, he learned Gaelic so well that one Irish woman remarked, "Isn't it grand that we have an Irish bishop!" Once on a visit to Germany, he came back to the house he was staying in soaked by rain. When his host suggested he change his shoes, John remarked, "The only way I could change my shoes is by putting the left one on the right foot and the right one on the left foot. This is the only pair I own."

John died on January 5, 1860 at the age of 48.
