Who Am I?

"I am more deadly than the screaming shell of the cannon. I win without killing. I tear down homes, break hearts, wreck lives. I travel on the wings of the wind. No innocence is strong enough to intimidate me, no purity pure enough to daunt me. I have no regard for truth, no respect for justice, no mercy for the defenseless. My victims are as numerous as the sands of the sea and often as innocent. I never forget and seldom forgive.

My name is Gossip."



St. James Intercisus, Martyr

Feastday: November 27

St. James was a native of Beth-Lapeta, a royal city in Persia and a nobleman of the first rank. He was a soldier and courtier to King Yezdigerd I of Persia in the early fifth century. James and his family were Christians. When his prince declared war against the Christian religion, James did not have the courage to renounce his royal master and benefactor's friendship. He abandoned the worship of the true God, declared war on the Christians, and renounced his faith for fear of death.

Upon the death of King Yezdigerd, James' family, who had not renounced their beliefs, contacted James and chastised him for having renounced his Heavenly King. They warned him of the error of his ways and the loss of his eternal soul if he continued on this path. James was greatly affected by their letter and ended his persecution of Christians. He was deeply troubled with guilt over what he had done and he went through a true conversion to the living God. He wanted to make amends and professed his faith before all. His words were soon carried to the new king, who immediately sent for him. The Saint boldly confessed himself a Christian before the new ruler and was condemned to death for his beliefs.

The name 'Intercisus' which was given to St. James documents the manner of his death. The word literally means 'hacked to pieces.' James was hung from a beam and slowly cut into 28 pieces, beginning with his fingers and then his toes, hands, and so forth until his beheading, the final cut.

Even though the crowd, made up of many Christians, urged him to renounce his faith and worship the sun because they could not bear to see him suffer such excruciating torture. He never renounced his faith. Instead, he made every piece cut from his body an offering to the Living God and thus won the crown of martyrdom.

James Intercisus is the patron saint of lost vocations and torture victims. The Church of St. James Intercisus in the Armenian Quarter of Jerusalem is dedicated to him.
