Michael the Archangel

Feastday: September 6th

Michael is an archangel in Hebrew, Christian and Islamic tradition. He is viewed as the field commander of the Army of God. He is mentioned by name in the Book of Daniel, the Book of Jude and the Book of Revelation in which he leads God's armies against Satan's forces during his uprising. In the book of Daniel, Michael appears as "one of the chief princes" who in Daniel's vision comes to the Archangel Gabriel's aid in his contest with the angel of Persia (Devil). Michael is also described there as the advocate of Israel and "great prince who stands up for the children of Daniel's people".

In Hebrew, the name Michael means "who is like God", which in Talmudic tradition is posed as a rhetorical question: "Who is like God?" to imply that no one is like God.

Much of the detail about Michael was transmitted to Christianity through the Book of Enoch, where it was taken up and further elaborated. In late medieval Christianity, Michael, together with Saint George, became the patron saint of chivalry, and of the first chivalric order of France, the Order of Saint Michael of 1469.

In the British honors system, a chivalric order founded in 1818 is also named for these two saints, the Order of St Michael and St George. St Michael is also considered in many Christian circles as the patron saint of the warrior. Police officers and soldiers, particularly paratroopers and fighter pilots, regard him as their patron. He is also a patron of Germany, the City of Brussels and Kiev.

SEPTEMBER THE MONTH OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS

The devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows and the Seven Sorrows of Mary goes back to the apostolic times.

St. John the Evangelist can be considered as one of the first devotees of the Mother of Sorrows. He witnessed first-hand and then recorded in his Gospel that Mary stood by the Cross of her Son (Jn 19:25). The Blessed Mother suffered with grief at seeing her Son, who is also her God, die an agonizing death by crucifixion at Calvary.

Simeon prophesied at the Presentation of the Jesus at the Temple, that Mary's soul would be pierced by a sword so that the thoughts of many hearts would be revealed (Lk 2:35). Mary, as the first and greatest disciple of her Son, participated in a most deep and profound way in the redemptive work of Our Lord.

The Seven Sorrows had been honored by the Church since the 14th century. These came to be known as the seven dolours (sorrows) of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The seven swords symbolize the seven sorrows of Our Lady's life. Devotion to the Sorrows of Mary gave rise to the figure in Christian art of the Pietà, the sorrowing Mother holding the dead Body of her Son who has been taken down from the Cross. These are: 1) The Prophecy of Simeon, 2) The Flight into Egypt, 3) The Loss of the Holy Child at Jerusalem, 4) Mary meets Jesus Carrying the Cross, 5) Mary witnesses the Crucifixion and Death of Jesus, 6) Mary Receives the Dead Body of Her Son, 7) The Burial of Her Son and Closing of the Tomb.
